#### Uniform

Just before Easter I wrote in the newsletter to help clarify the expectations in terms of school uniform and I thought that I would remind everyone of the importance to dress in appropriate school uniform.

Maintaining high standards of dress is important and will only happen if children, teachers and staff at the school and parents work together to dress appropriately. The reason that I have had to raise the profile of uniform at this point, is that there are a number of children who are regularly turning up to school dressed in clothing and footwear that is inappropriate for school. I would like to make it clear that training shoes are not part of the daily school uniform and similarly boots (ankle, calf length and knee length) are not suitable. I attach below a page from the School Prospectus that clearly outlines school uniform expectations. Please work with us to ensure we maintain high standards.

#### Unauthorised Exceptional Leave of Absence Information

The law requires parents to ensure their children receive an efficient full time education, and every minute of every day is important. Please help them not to miss any of this valuable time.

We hope that when you have read the information outlined on our website, you will consider that your child's education is too important to take holidays during term time.

If an unauthorised leave of absence is taken, this may incur a penalty notice being issued under Section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action

#### Unauthorised Late Marks Information

If your child is arriving late - after the register has closed at 9am, it will be coded as a U which, is an unauthorised late mark. If your child accrues 10 unauthorised late marks within 100 sessions (10 weeks) you will be committing an offence under the Education Act 1996.

The School may refer the matter to Cornwall Council who may decide to take legal action against you., issuing a penalty notice under Section 444A and 444B of the Education Act 1996. This carries a fine of £60 if paid within 21 days or £120 if paid after this but within 28 days. Failure to pay the penalty notice will result in Court action.

Persistent absences/unauthorised lates, not authorised by the school, may result in a prosecution in the Magistrates Court, leading to fines up to £2,500 and / or custodial sentences.


